Mission & Vision

Our **mission** is to provide older adults with affordable recovery services for alcohol and drug addiction.

Our **vision** is a sober future where barriers to treatment are removed and older adults receive the support needed to maintain recovery.

Our Values

- Open mindedness: We welcome individuals wherever they are in their recovery journey
- 02 Community: We believe that recovery is a lifetime process that takes place within a community of peers
- O3 Connection: We believe that maintaining healthy relationships is essential isolation is both a cause and effect of the disease

Who we serve:

Silver Sobriety was created for adults aged 50+ who are seeking recovery from alcohol and/or drug dependency, are willing to engage in our program, and are physically and psychologically stable. We are located in Stillwater and focus on serving the East Metro, but clients may participate in person or virtually from anywhere.

Why focus on seniors?

In 2016, of the 350 treatment centers in Minnesota, 140 programs were specific to adolescents – and two were geared toward seniors. In addition, most people don't realize that Medicare does not cover treatment for older adults unless it is hospital-based. Also, older adults may not relate to younger people whose problems, life experiences, and drugs of choice are different from their own.

Scholarships and Transportation:

Silver Sobriety is founded on the idea of removing barriers that prevent seniors from achieving and sustaining sobriety – including affordability. As a non-residential program, the cost is much lower than a typical 30-day, in-patient treatment program. Many clients are eligible for scholarships that can cover up to 80% of the cost based on income. Additionally, we want to ensure transportation is not a barrier for our clients therefore, rides are available for those living within a 15-mile radius of the Stillwater Area.







Program Description

Silver Sobriety is a non-residential recovery program offering education, recovery services, and support to adults ages 50 and older. Our program uses the 12-Step Recovery Program to approach addiction and recovery. Clients participate in three, two-hour sessions each week for a period of six to twelve months. Each week, clients are provided with agespecific reading materials, recovery tasks and/or exercises to complete.

Throughout the program, we address the states of mind, body, and spirit as they relate to recovery, rehab, and good health for seniors. Topics may include strategies on how to handle loss, depression, loneliness, cognitive difficulties, chronic pain and grief. Left untreated, these emotional issues commonly experienced by older adults can lead to or aggravate chemical dependency problems.

Silver Sobriety's program complements traditional rehab treatment programs. We assist our clients before, during and after treatment, and make referrals for a higher level of care as needed.

Would you recommend Silver Sobriety to someone else facing substance use challenges later in life?




Success Stories
